**(e) Convention Report 1992.**

A detailed final report including recommendations was submitted in writing by Dr. Ray Greenfeld, Chairman of the meeting in Victoria. There was a net loss of \$911.69 and a registration of 69 dentists and 38 spouses.

The meeting was a great success and the members of the committee, Ray Greenfeld, Tom Erskine, Len Atkinson, Gerry Gass, and David Nerman were thanked by the Executive for a job well done!

The Convention Committee Report was to be a model for all future meeting reports.

**(f) Convention Report 1993.**

1. An interim written report was submitted along with a proposed budget.
2. Bill Kost updated the Executive on the local arrangements at Deerhurst Resort.
3. Terry Smorang had finalized the program, Wayne Pulver had already reported on the Teacher's Workshop.
4. Air Canada was to be asked to be the official carrier and if free ticket(s) were ever earned for accumulated bonus points they were to be dealt with according to the following motion: Any free airline tickets earned through sponsorship of an Annual Meeting were to be used at the discretion of the Executive to help defray travel costs of the Executive members at future meetings. Proposed by Terry Smorang, seconded by Barry Chapnick. **MOTION CARRIED.**
6. Registration was to be handled by Randy Taylor and Bill Wiseman.

6. The registration fee was set at \$250 on a vote by the Executive.

7. On a vote by the Executive it was decided to have commercial exhibitors at the meeting. Randy Taylor and Bill Wiseman were to follow up on this and check with Deerhurst to see if space was available. Barry Chapnick was to assist Bill Kost in implementation.

**Annual Meetings.** Executive then addressed the recommendations made of Ray Greenfeld's 1992 Annual Meeting Report.

1. Registration policy at future meetings for the President of the C.A.E., the Executive Secretary, and the Convention Committee. On a motion by Lorne Chapnick, seconded by Barry Chapnick, henceforth:
  - a. The President's travel expenses and accommodation at Annual Meetings would be paid for by the C.A.E.
  - b. The Executive Secretary's travel expenses, accommodations and registration at the Annual Meeting would be paid for by the C.A.E.
  - c. No other conventions expenses for committee chairpersons or members would be provided for by the C.A.E.
  - d. These changes would be included in the Rules and Procedures Policy Manual **MOTION CARRIED.**

2. Policy concerning C.A.E. member speakers. The Executive agreed that it was the responsibility of the Convention Committee to see that non-member guest speakers be encouraged to attend our social functions, and to be entertained by members, where and when appropriate at C.A.E. expense.

3. Policy regarding attendance at the C.A.E. Annual Meeting by foreign society

presidents. The registration fee and travel expenses would be the responsibility of the visiting President.

4. The present Convention Manual is to be upgraded by an ad hoc committee appointed by the President and the revisions submitted to the executive at their next meeting in August.

5. Wayne Acheson then presented a flow chart or "Schemata" to Executive highlighting the importance of long range planning for future Annual Meetings.

A motion to accept the "Schemata" as the official policy of the C.A.E. was made by Joel Edelson, seconded by Paul Teplitsky. **MOTION CARRIED.** Copy enclosed. Henceforth, convention chairpersons would be appointed 2 years in advance of their meeting.

6. Wayne Pulver suggested using a "Conference Planner" for future C.A.E. Meetings and was to look into it and report back to Executive at the Deerhurst Meeting.

7. The 1994 Annual Meeting at the Kananaskis Lodge.

a. John Fraser was to be the Convention Chairperson.

b. Speakers are already being contacted.

8. 1994 A.A.E. Meeting in Hawaii. Wayne Pulver reported on the proposed pre-A.A.E. joint C.A.E.-Australian Endodontic Society Meeting for Monday, April 25, 1994. He will continue to work with the President of the A.E.S. on our behalf.

9. A.A.E.'s proposed Quality Assurance Guidelines were reviewed by Executive for possible use in formulating Standards of Practice Guidelines in Canada. Lionel Lenkinski suggested that Standards of Practice perhaps were not a national issue but a matter of provincial jurisdiction. Nevertheless, Lorne Chapnick recommended that this topic be put on the agenda of the next Procedure Guide Committee meeting as an item of discussion.

10. Possible future meeting sites:

a. 1995 Annual Meeting. Steve Brayton was to contact the Newfoundland Dental Society about the possibility of a combined meeting along the lines of the Saskatchewan meeting in 1990 and report back to the Executive at Deerhurst.

b. Mid-winter Executive Meeting, Winter of 1994. Terry Smorang and Wayne Pulver were to look into the possibility of holding this meeting at Lake Louise.

11. It was discussed and agreed by Executive that it was important that the Executive support the appointed committee chairpersons and their committees in all their endeavours on behalf of the C.A.E.

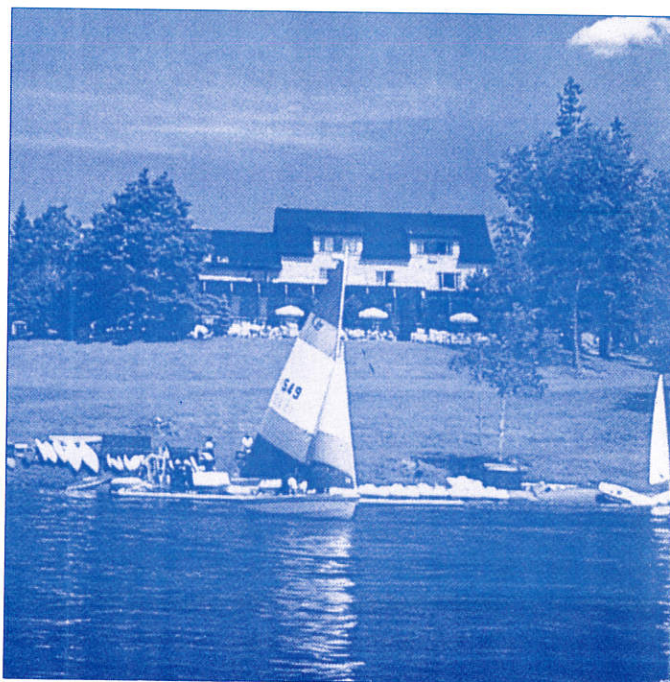
